Career as a Financial Planner

The <u>Good Universities Guide</u> states that *financial planners develop and implement financial plans for individuals covering all areas of finance, including taxation, retirement, superannuation, insurance and estate planning*. Financial planning is a discipline on its own – one does not have to be an accountant to be a financial planner. There are number courses offered at universities in *business, commerce, finance, economics* and it is important to also note that should students wish to become a financial planner, the course they choose must be accredited by ASIC (Australian Securities and Investment Commission) or they may not be eligible to provide financial advice.


