3. The new movie “**SONIC THE HEDGEHOG**” has just begun in Australian cinemas. Sonic, the Hedgehog was previously a star in the Sega computer game. He is a very speedy extraterrestrial. How many of the letters in the word “extraterrestrial” are used more than once? What are those letters?



4. Popular rapper/singer Lizzo sang at a recent Awards ceremony dressed in an M&M lolly-themed outfit, wearing a sash that said “**MILK CHOCOLATE**”. What fraction of the letters in the words on that sash are vowels? And, what fraction of those words are adjectives?

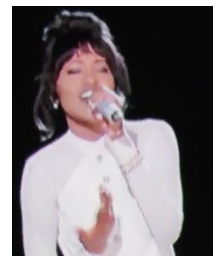

7. Hollywood has now produced a **HOLOGRAM MOVIE** of singer Whitney Houston singing some of her best-loved songs. A hologram of Whitney is in the foreground, with two **REAL** backing singers actually standing in the background. What **FRACTION** of that “group” of 3 are real people?
