NEW COURSES

Victoria University is proud to announce two new courses available in 2021:

- Bachelor of Applied Movement Sciences/Master of Physiotherapy
- Bachelor of Nutritional Science/Master of Dietetics

We have also made an update to the Bachelor of Speech and Language Sciences/Master of Speech Pathology which commenced 2020.

Students can now preference these courses in VTAC.

BACHELOR OF APPLIED MOVEMENT SCIENCES/MASTER OF PHYSIOTHERAPY

This 4.5 year dual degree taught in the Block Model, will prepare students to become a physiotherapist and use rehabilitation, injury prevention and exercise to improve people's quality of life.

This course prepares work ready graduates through clinical placements in public hospitals, private health, sports, aged and community care, pediatrics, heart and lung disease and stroke with a person centred focus on mental health and wellness as well as cultural diversity and Indigenous health.

Admission criteria:

Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or at least 25 in English other than EAL; Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 25 in one of Biology, Chemistry, Maths: Mathematical Methods, Maths: Specialist Mathematics or Physics

This course considers ATAR as part of selection.

Current eligible Year 12 students participating in elite sport (players, coaches and officials) may receive an adjustment of 5 ATAR points towards their application for this course if they are approved as part of the <u>Elite Athletes program</u>.

<u>VU Guaranteed</u> Students can received an adjustment of 5 ATAR points towards their application for this course.

Second Year Entry for students who study at VU:

If students do not meet the Admission criteria for first year entry into the Bachelor of Applied Movement Sciences/Master of Physiotherapy, they will have an opportunity to apply for second year entry if they have completed at least two semesters in one of the following VU courses:

- Bachelor of Biomedical Sciences (HBBS)
- Bachelor of Biomedical Science and Exercise Science (HBES)

Meeting the minimum requirement for entry to second year does not guarantee entry. Places are limited and applicants will be competitively ranked based on their results.

BACHELOR OF NUTRITIONAL SCIENCE/MASTER OF DIETETICS

This dual degree will give students the food-related knowledge and clinical skills needed to work in private practice, care settings and public programs. Students will become adept at delivering strategies that help people and populations make better food choices to prevent and manage disease and illness.

Admission criteria:

Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or at least 25 in English other than EAL; Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 25 in one of Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Health & Human Development, Mathematics (any) or Physical Education.

This course considers ATAR as part of selection.

Current eligible Year 12 students participating in elite sport (players, coaches and officials) may receive an adjustment of 5 ATAR points towards their application for this course if they are approved as part of the <u>Elite Athletes program</u>.

<u>VU Guaranteed</u> Students can received an adjustment of 5 ATAR points towards their application for this course.

BACHELOR OF SPEECH AND LANGUAGE SCIENCES/MASTER OF SPEECH PATHOLOGY

This Australian-first dual degree will prepare students to support those with communication and/or speech and swallowing challenges. Graduates will play a crucial role in enabling communication and/or speech and improving swallowing disorders to enhance quality of life for those experiencing these difficulties, as well as support their families and broader community.

Admission criteria:

Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL) or at least 25 in any other English, plus a study score of at least 20 in two of Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics (any), Psychology, Sociology, Texts and Traditions, Health and Human Development, or LOTE (any).

This course uses the ATAR as part of its selection considerations.

Current eligible Year 12 students participating in elite sport (players, coaches and officials) may receive an adjustment of 5 ATAR points towards their application for this course if they are approved as part of the <u>Elite Athletes program</u>.

<u>VU Guaranteed</u> Students can received an adjustment of 5 ATAR points towards their application for this course.
