<p>Read some picture story books for enjoyment and write a letter to your favourite character.</p>	<p>Research healthy snack ideas for your school lunchbox and follow one to add into your lunchbox.</p>	<p>Draw a picture of yourself and write some positive qualities, both inside and out.</p>
