ISA Div 1 Rd 10 – 1st XI v St Stanislaus College Bathurst at Bathurst, Saturday 23 February 2019

The ISA competition round saw the 1st XI travel to Bathurst. One of the few times in the season, the 1st XI fielded first and began strongly with Liam Chang and Josh Hooper taking two early wickets. The opposition captain played very aggressively to record a fine century, however the 1st XI fought back well to take 9 wickets. Hayden Robertson and Liam Chang bowled at the stumps to take three wickets each, Alec Favelle took two wickets and Tim McLachlan took three catches including a fine snare to dismiss the centurion.

Chasing a formidable 271, Tom Colgan attacked from the opening over in scoring a quick-fire 25. Joe Colgan, played a very mature innings of 82 which was his first 1st XI half century. While others made starts on the quick outfield and small boundaries. The run rate proved too high at the end with the 1st XI finishing with a creditable total of 205.

Tied Match between SPX Red and St Augustine's White after 30 Overs

Following a spate of very warm Saturday mornings throughout December and February , the SPX Red were greeted with a wet and drizzly morning at Killarney Heights oval for its scheduled match with St Augustine's white of Brookvale. If history was to go by this match was again to be a very close contest , with past matches generally going down to the last over and the final few balls, and this one was certainly no different.

With SPX Red again winning the toss the decision was to send the opposition into bat and hope that the outfield and pitch would dry up going into later that morning. The innings did not start well for St Augustine's as they lost their first wicket of the day in the first over from a beautiful swinging delivery by Antony DiMauro, removing the middle stump of the opening batter for a duck. Bowling was tight for SPX Red as Antony DiMauro, Darcy Keenlyside and Will Ramsbottom all used the conditions to trouble the St Augustine's batsmen. Whilst conditions did favor the bowling the cool conditions, slight drizzle and overcast conditions did trouble the SPX Red bowlers who also had trouble controlling the swinging and seaming ball. The Achilles heel for the SPX Red side in Wides and No-Balls again reared its ugly head and despite a steady fall of wickets throughout the match the Sundries total remained top scorer for the St Augustine's team. With no batsmen for St Augustine's registering double figures, the opposition reached 9/97 at the end of the 30 overs , with SPX Red contributing an embarrassing 55 sundries to the total. Bowling accolades go to James Maloney (2/11), Aiden Wilson (1/18 and direct hit run out), Antony DiMauro (1/4) , Declan Carroll (1/8), Will Ramsbottom (1/8) and Andrew Guerrera (1/15).

With the cloud cover breaking into small periods of sun light between passing drizzle, SPX Red set about chasing what looked like a gettable total. Opening with our premier batsmen in Declan Carroll and Cormac Molloy SPX Red showed their intent to get the runs before heavy rain could interrupt the match. Both batsmen however failed to settle into their rhythm and SPX Red found themselves at 2/16, both batsmen in the shed and the team ready to dig in and fight for the runs. Last week's batting hero in Nick Green was joined at the crease by James Maloney and both steadied the ship to take the total to 3/52 at the halfway mark of the inning's. The innings will be remembered for the first six of the season by the team, with Nick Green registering the score with a lusty hit over the mid-on boundary. With the fall of Nick Greens wickets Aiden Wilson joined James Maloney to whittle away the runs and set up a good partnership to take the score to 4/77 at the beginning of the 25th over, which saw James Maloney retire not out on the batsmen high score of the day of 18 (rtno). The remaining overs were a tense affair as St Augustine's resumed their top line bowlers to slow down the scoring rate for SPX red. With 3 runs to get from the last over of the day SPX Red charge was halted with the fall of Aiden Wilson on the second ball of the over and the fall of Leo Hart on the 5 ball of the over. This brought Antony DiMauro to the crease to face the last ball of the day to try and hit two runs to win the match. Alas, a single was all that a good shot to mid-on was able to register and the game finished in a historic tie between the two catholic schools.

Both teams fought hard all the way in a wet and overcast day and SPX Red were left to lament what could have been if they could only control the sundries column on the score sheet.
