Mark 4:26-34 offers two parables that illustrate the nature of God's kingdom: the Parable of the Growing Seed and the Parable of the Mustard Seed. These stories invite us to reflect on the Power of love and its transformative effect in our lives and the world.

In the Parable of the Growing Seed on the ground. The seed sprouts and grows, though the farmer does not know how. This parable reminds us of the mysterious and organic nature of love. Just as the see grows unseen and almost miraculously, love takes root and flourishes in our hearts and communities in ways we often do not fully understand. Our role is to scatter the seeds of love, to act with kindness, compassion, and generosity, trusting that these acts will grow and bear fruit in their own time.

The Parable of the Mustard Seed highlights the small beginnings of the kingdom of God and its eventual, surprising greatness. Love, too, often begins with small gestures—a kind word, a smile, a helping hand. These seemingly insignificant acts, rooted in love, can grow into something vast and sheltering, providing comfort and support to many, much like the mustard plant's branches provide refuge for birds. Love's humble beginnings can lead to significant impacts, nurturing a community and fostering a sense of belonging and peace.

Together, these parables teach us that love is both a seed we plant and a tree that grows. It is both a small beginning and a great outcome. Love works quietly and persistently, transforming lives and communities in ways we may not immediately see but can trust are happening. By embracing love in our daily actions, we participate in the divine process of growth and transformation, contributing to a world that reflects the kingdom of God—a kingdom characterised by care, compassion and profound connection

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:6-10



Gospel: Mark 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.' He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.' Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.


