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What We Are Learning In...

Reading

Reading different types of texts for specific purposes using text processing strategies, including monitoring meaning, skimming, scanning and reviewing

Identifying the similarities and differences between quoted and reported speech used in texts.

- Quoted (direct): "I want to go to the park today," said James.
- Reported (indirect): James told me he wanted to go to the park today.

Reading and compositing non-fiction texts about countries from Africa, South America and Asia.

Planning, rehearsing and delivering an informative presentation about sustainability

<u>Writing</u>

Planning, drafting and publishing an information report.

- ANZAC Day
- A Country from around the world

Students are learning to read information, take notes and re-write in their own words. They will learn to use sub-headings and write information into TEEL paragraphs.

Spelling patterns

 Class patterns will be 'ou' words, adding ing/ed to words and topic words

Writing using clearly formed joined letters with increased fluency

<u>Maths</u>

Recognising two-dimensional shapes that are the faces of three-dimensional objects.

Describe two dimensional shapes that result from combining and splitting shapes.

Developing efficient mental and written strategies for multiplication and for division where there is no remainder.

Making connections between multiplication and division.

Practicing multiplication facts.

Using simple scales, legends and directions to interpret information contained in basic maps.

List the probabilities of everyday events and identify dependent and independent events.

Integrated/Inquiry Learning

How Can We Be Caretakers of our World?

Students will learn that living things can be grouped on the basis of observable features and can be distinguished from non-living things.

Students will learn that different living things have different life cycles and depend on each other and the environment to survive.

Students will Investigate food preparation techniques used in modern or traditional societies.

Students will investigate the Earth's rotation on its axis causes regular changes, including night and day.

<u>Religion</u>

First Eucharist

To begin Term 2, students will learn about the importance of receiving their First Eucharist. They will learn about the connections between our families, local Parish, Archdiocese and Papacy.

Identity & Diversity

Students will explore key figures from our Church's history and compare our Catholic faith to that of other denominations.
