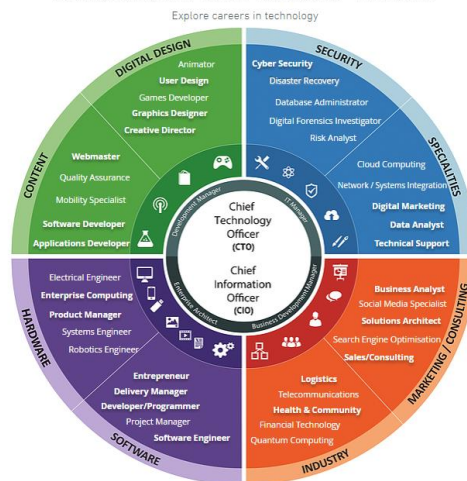

UniReady in Schools – New Non ATAR Pathway to Curtin

Curtin University has recognised that many students are admitted to its courses via non ATAR enrolments and have expanded the [UniReady](#) program so that schools can now deliver it in year 11 and/or 12. The first schools have started delivering this program this year.

This is a WACE Endorsed Program. Students who successfully complete the program are eligible to enrol in [a number of Curtin courses](#) (not courses like medicine, engineering and law). Any other subjects that students complete as part of their WACE will **NOT** impact on their eligibility for Curtin.

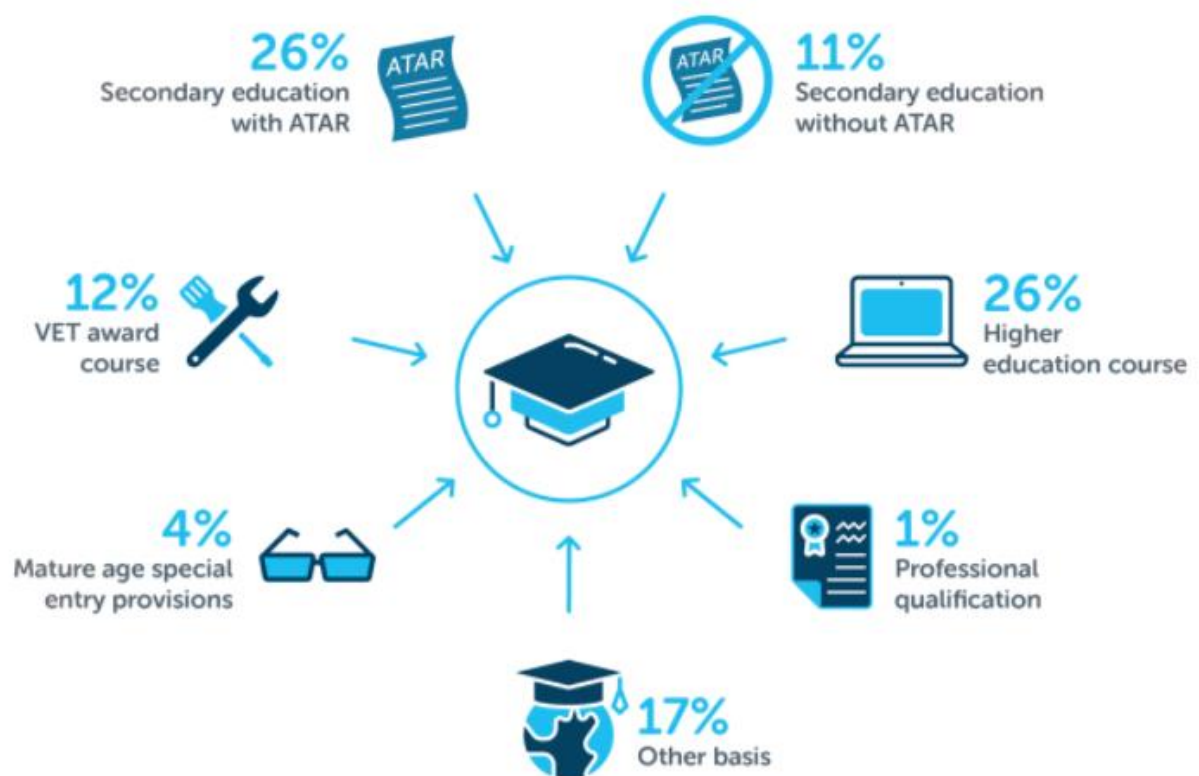


Crunching the number: Exploring the use and usefulness of ATAR

Basis of admission for commencing domestic undergraduate enrolments, 2016

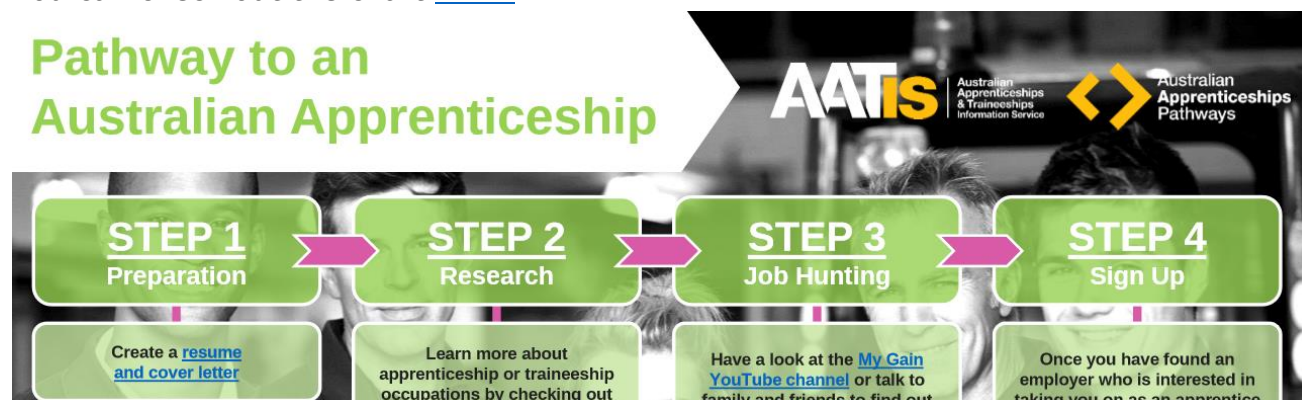

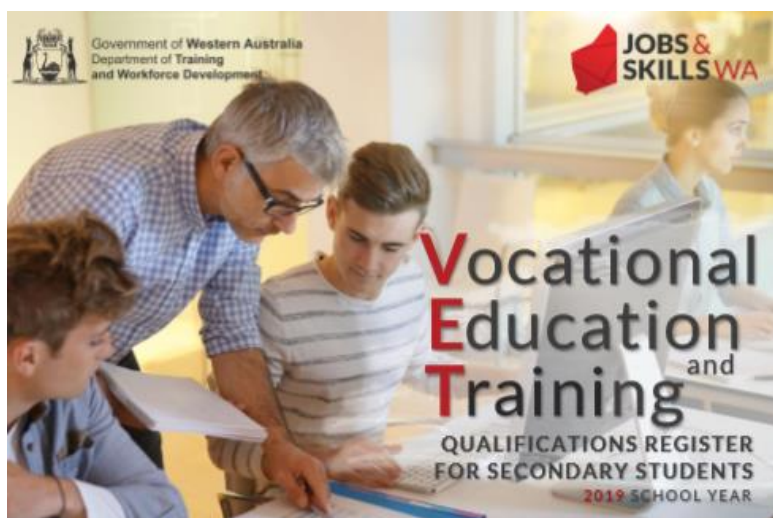
How Good is Your Course?

Some qualifications aren't worth the paper they are written on.

I don't want a nurse looking after me who hasn't had on the job training and I don't want a school leaver with a Certificate IV in Business Management running my business thanks.

When you realise that an electrician qualification is at Certificate III level you will appreciate how inappropriate it is for students to do a Certificate IV in a school classroom.

Most Certificate IVs have been identified as unsuitable for school students on the [VET in Schools register](#) because:



- Delivery is not supported due to the skill level and experience required to complete the qualification to an industry standard and difficulties in finding relevant work placements with duties and responsibilities aligned to the units of competency within this qualification.
- There is insufficient time to complete this qualification while at school.
- Students completing this qualification at school are unlikely to be employed in anything but entry level roles as they generally lack the work and industry experience required for employment in leadership positions.
- Students should complete a lower level qualification in conjunction with other industry qualifications to enhance employment opportunities and/or progress into further training.

Delivering Cert IV in schools became a backdoor way of gaining access to university. That process it undermined the value of good qualify VET qualifications delivered under optimal conditions.

Pre-Apprenticeships

So you want to do an apprenticeship but don't know which one.

Pre-apprenticeships that are run in TAFE colleges have you learning from tradies and you may get work experience in the industry. They may have you learning in a school of trades, like construction or automotive so that you get a range of experiences.

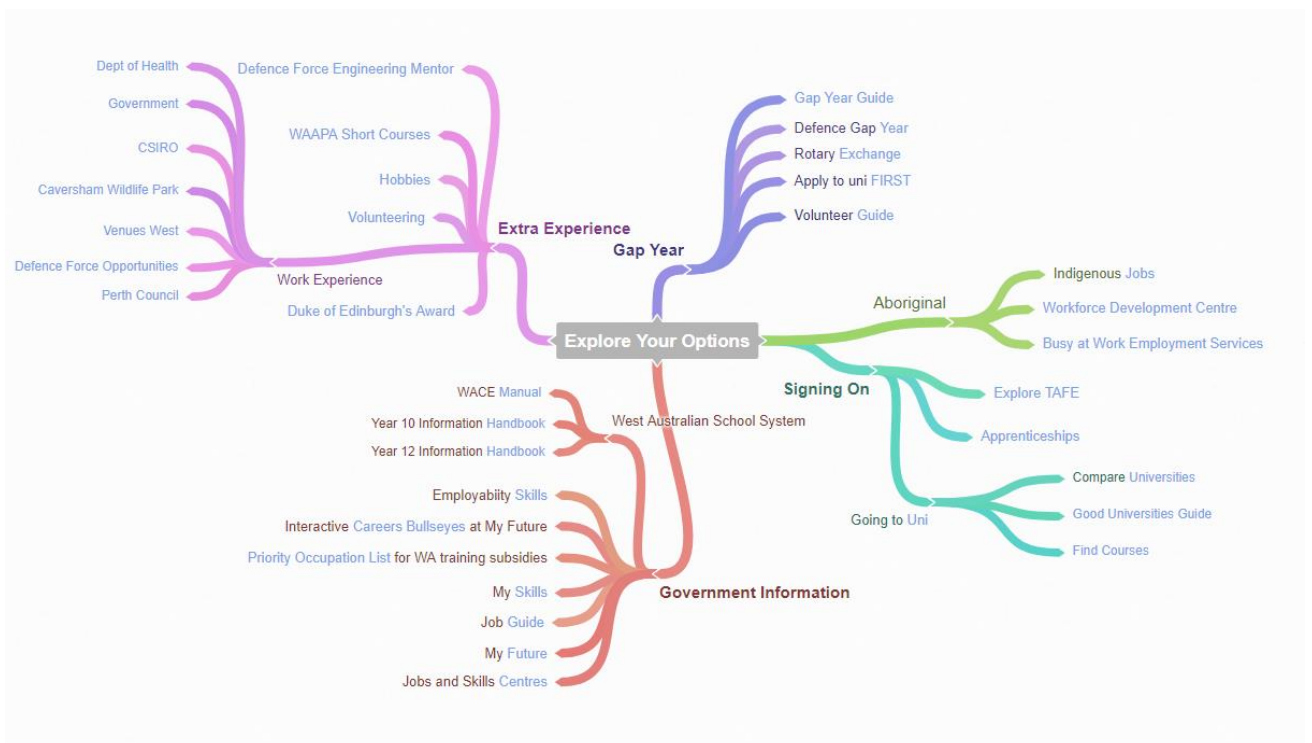

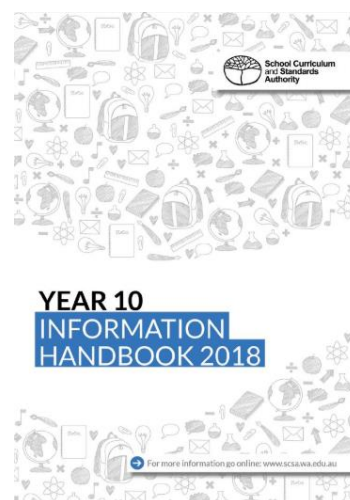

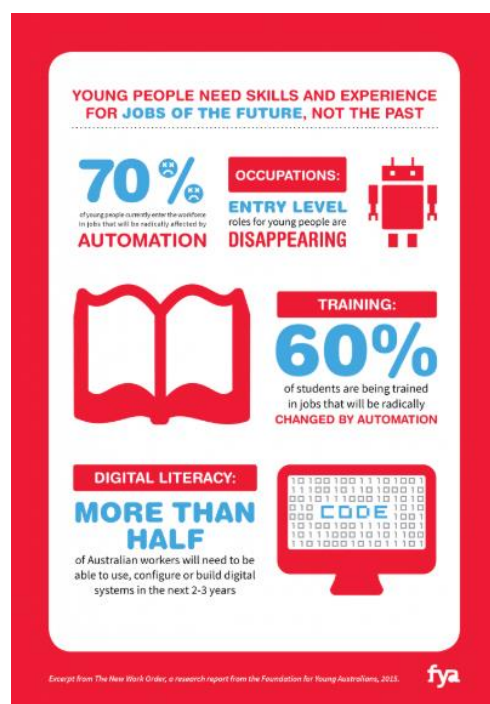
CEAWA - Career Education is Everybody's Business

CDAA Hot Topic Breakfast - Equal Opportunity in Job Applications

Two career advisors at the May Hot Topics breakfast reported being asked to identify their age in an online government job application. Age discrimination is against the law.

Another reported school students being asked to include a photo in their application to work in a hospitality chain outlet.

A job seeker who refuses to supply a photo or identify their age when requested has little chance of getting an interview!!

On the other hand, it would be difficult for a job advertiser to justify their request if the case went to the [Equal Opportunity Commission](#). I contacted both organisations that were spoken about and was assured there is NO DISCRIMINATION AROUND HERE!!

Bottom line, under the [Equal Opportunity Act](#) you have a right to be treated fairly. If you choose to put your photo and details onto social media and employer can find you easily but that is your choice.

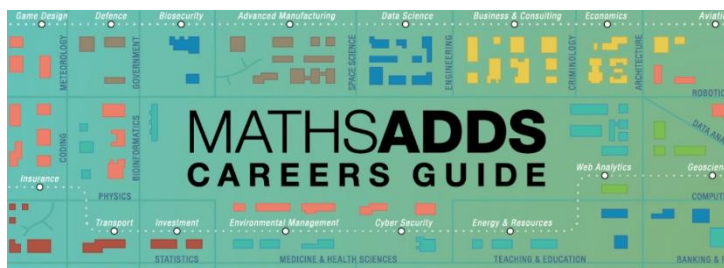

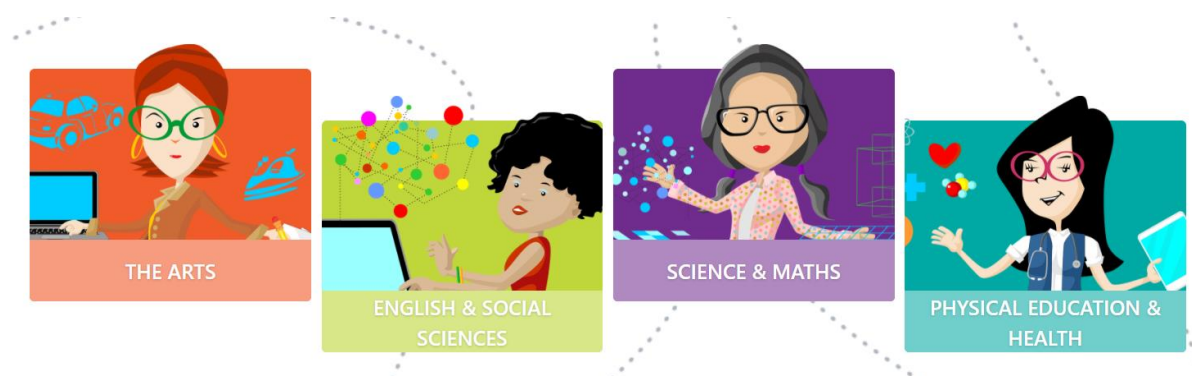

The total number of jobs opening in the next few years will be about 0.5m per year but over half of these will be replacing people who have moved on, particularly from low skilled low paid jobs.

- Employment is continuing to shift towards higher skilled jobs.



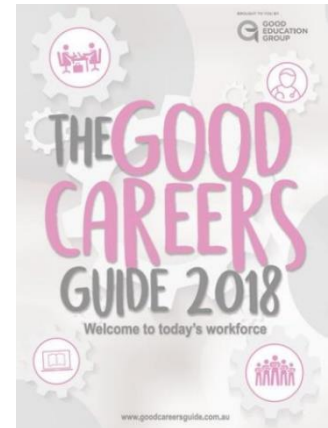
- There is high replacement demand for people going into retirement.

- Reasonably high proportions of job openings due to replacement demand are also found amongst technicians and trade workers (for example, 60.4% for bricklayers, carpenters and joiners and 61.1% for automotive electricians and mechanics). As experienced workers leave, there are fewer available to supervise apprentices. Additionally, as apprenticeship training takes time, and completion rates can be low, sufficient recruitment is needed to avoid future shortages.
