Apprenticeships and traineeships let you earn while you learn. You'll get paid, gain hands-on experience and complete a nationally recognised qualification. Traineeships usually take 1–2 years and cover a wide range of industries, while apprenticeships typically take 3–4 years to become a qualified tradesperson. Grader Operator - What's that?

Grader Operators use a grader to spread and level materials on construction sites. Graders are used to build and maintain dirt and gravel access roads and prepare surfaces for asphalt. Tasks and duties:

- Using manual and hydraulic controls on machinery to raise, lower and manoeuvre attachments.
- Selecting, attaching and removing attachments such as buckets, scoops, blades and hammers.
- Following plans, markers and verbal instructions.
- Operating controls to excavate, break, drill, level, compact, gouge, move, load and spread earth, rubble, soil and other materials.
- Following safety protocols.
- Performing minor adjustments and maintenance on plant.
- Lubricating, cleaning and refuelling machinery and positioning it ready for use.

Grader Operators typically work on roadworks and construction projects in industries such as civil engineering, mining and construction. How to get there?

1. Gain your construction induction training card (White Card).
2. Complete a Certificate III in Civil Construction (RII30920). This may be completed as part of an apprenticeship.
3. Complete pre-employment medical and police checks and drug and alcohol screening when required.
4. Build your skills and attain licences to operate other types of machinery to strengthen your career options as a skilled, all-round operator.

Group Training Organisations (GTOs) in Queensland can organise Apprenticeships and Traineeships

Group Training Organisations (GTOs) hire apprentices and trainees, then place them with different employers to complete their training. What that means:

- You're employed by the GTO, not the business
- You can work with different employers during your training
- They help with support, paperwork and finding placements

Registered Nurse (RN)

Registered Nurses assess, plan and provide care for patients and supervise other nursing staff. They work in hospitals, aged care, medical centres and other healthcare settings. To become an RN, you need to complete a Bachelor of Nursing and register with the [Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency \(AHPRA\)](#). Enrolled Nurse (EN)

Enrolled Nurses work under the supervision of Registered Nurses, helping to provide patient care in hospitals, aged care and community settings. Midwife

HOT TIP: Make sure your public social media profile is presentable! Employers often look at profiles to review potential employees.

Aspire Scholarship Scheme:

- Value: \$4,500
- Duration: First year of study

Residential Scholarship Scheme:

- Value: Varies between \$4,500- \$20,000+ / year
- Duration: Varies from 1 year to minimum program completion time
- Approved Accommodation Providers

Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Education Scholarship Scheme:

- Value: Varies between \$500 - \$15,000 / year
- Duration: Varies from 1 year to minimum program completion time

You only need one application to be considered for all three schemes.

Youth Allowance and Rent Assist for students and Australian Apprentices

Youth Allowance is a financial payment from the Australian Government to support students and Australian apprentices while they gain their qualifications. To get this, you must be one of the following:

- 18 to 24 and studying full time
- 16 to 17, studying full time and either independent or needing to live away from home to study
- 16 to 17, studying full time and have completed Year 12 or equivalent
- 16 to 24 and doing a full time Australian Apprenticeship.

QTAC Myths vs Facts

There are plenty of myths about the ATAR—here are the facts!

- Myth:** Certificate I & II, IB, Music or Dance automatically count towards your ATAR.
Fact: Your ATAR is based on General subjects, Applied subjects, and completed VET Certificate III or higher qualifications. You also need at least 4 General subjects
- Myth:** Some Maths or Science subjects scale better.
Fact: No subject is guaranteed to scale better. Your ATAR depends on how well you perform compared with other students.

3. **Myth:** You can choose subjects that guarantee a 99.95 ATAR.
Fact: There's no secret subject combination. The best way to maximise your ATAR is to do well in all your subjects.
4. **Myth:** You only get an ATAR if you apply to QTAC.
Fact: If you're eligible and registered for an ATAR, QTAC will calculate it, even if you don't apply for university.
5. **Myth:** No ATAR means no university.
Fact: Many courses have alternative entry pathways, including VET qualifications and pathway programs.

Remember, your ATAR is simply a ranking used for university entry—it doesn't measure your intelligence or ability to succeed at Uni or TAFE and definitely doesn't determine your future success.

Additional entry requirements for Nursing and/or Midwifery

To enrol in Nursing and/or Midwifery at any university you must meet the following educational requirements:

- **English is your primary language** AND you have attended and satisfactorily completed at least six years of primary and secondary education taught and assessed solely in English.

At least two years of this education must have been between grades 7 and 12.

- You are already **registered with AHPRA** as an Enrolled Nurse (EN), Registered Nurse (RN), or Midwife.
- If you do not meet the above criteria you will need to sit an approved **English language proficiency test**.

Provisional entry for the Doctor of Medicine (MD)

Medicine Provisional Entry (Pre-offers) are merit based and ranked using your results as follows:

- 50% MMI (Multiple Mini Interview)
- 25% UCAT score
- 25% Adjusted ATAR (minimum 95.00)

Successful applicants typically have a median UCAT of 3110 and an adjusted ATAR of 99.95. If you don't qualify for provisional entry, you can complete a [recommended bachelor's degree](#) first and then apply for the [graduate-entry medicine pathway](#) in your final year. You can meet the other requirements for this pathway (e.g. subject prerequisites) while you complete your bachelor's degree.
