9 QUEST Alpine Day Walk and Coasteering Journey: Friday 5 March 2021

Dear 9 QUEST Parents and Carers,

As part of the 9 QUEST Program in Term 1, we will be heading off-campus this Friday 5 March to undertake 2 activities: Alpine Day Walk on Mount Wellington, and a Coasteering Journey from Kingston Beach to Blackmans Bay.

The alpine day walk begins at The Springs, and follows the Ice-House Track to the South Wellington Track and the summit of Mount Wellington, then a descent along the Zig-Zag Track to The Springs. This is an alpine walk in a rugged and beautiful natural environment exposed to the elements, with steep and rocky terrain.

The Coasteering Journey begins at the southern end of Kingston Beach, near the Sailing Club, and progresses along the coastline to the northern end of Blackmans Bay Beach. Coasteering involves making passage along a shoreline. The group may need to walk, scramble and swim to complete the journey. Jumps from modest heights into deep water may be required. This activity is weather and swell dependent.

Students will be divided into 2 groups, as per the Sea-Kayaking and Indoor Rock Climbing Day on Friday 26 February following Camp. Group 1 will take part in the Coasteering Journey, and Group 2 will take part in the Alpine Day Walk. These groups will remain until the end of Term 1. Students have been notified of their groups in a group briefing and via email.

Please note: students should bring all of the following equipment, regardless of forecast weather.

Alpine Day Walk:

- PE uniform including pair of joggers with good grip
- Morning tea & lunch
- Day pack (school backpack okay)
- At least 1 litre of drinking water
- A sunhat & sunscreen (warm beanie might be more appropriate)
- A waterproof rain jacket
- A warm fleece long-sleeve top / jacket
- Personal medications required to self-manage in a non-urban setting

Coasteering:

Full-length wet-suit (the College has a limited supply available to students)

- Pair of joggers with good grip OR booties with thick sole and good grip
- Towel
- Morning tea & lunch
- At least 1 litre of drinking water
- A sunhat & sunscreen
- Personal medications required to self-manage in a non-urban setting
- The College will provide helmets and pfds (personal flotation devices)

The staff group will carry first-aid kits and mobile phones. Group 1 (Coasteering) will be accompanied and supervised by Mrs Desiréé Smuts and Mr Ben Jarvis. Group 2 (Alpine Day Walk) will be accompanied and supervised by Mr Todd Barker and Mr David Witcomb.

Mr Witcomb and Mr Jarvis, both experienced bus drivers, will transport the student and staff group in two College buses and / or Wisby buses.

Students will leave Southern Christian College at 9:00am after Pastoral Care on Friday 5 March and return to College <u>at approximately 3:00pm</u>.
