# Why 'Christ Our Light', and the new logo?

Following the discernment sessions earlier this year, a Christological emphasis/charism emerged. Both parish patrons, Our Lady, and St Agnes, are consistently understood in terms of their relationship to Christ. We think about Mary who accepted what God had asked of her, to bear the Christ child, to bring forth the One who is 'the Light of the world', and of her faithfulness, even to her presence at the foot of her Son's cross. Considering St Agnes, aware of her story, she was a young girl who was prepared to inform any would-be suitor that she was 'already promised to Christ, the Lord of the Universe; The One who was more splendid than the sun and the stars...'

You may, or may not, be aware that St Agnes Parish Primary School's motto has been, and is, 'Light in Darkness'. Bringing the two parishes together as one represents a coming home of sorts, given Our Lady of the Assumption, Cheltenham, was cut off from St Agnes' Highett, its mother parish, back in 1958. Reflecting upon the existing logos of our two respective parish and school communities, and how there was some consistency between the two, particularly in terms of shape and colour, a new logo was envisaged that endeavoured to incorporate both this consistency of shape and colour, and represent 'Christ Our Light'.
