The official definition of feminism is the theory of the political, economic, and social equality of the sexes. Seems irrelevant now we have the vote, and the Anti-discrimination act doesn't it? Wrong. Currently, the gender pay gap is at 14%. While this is an improvement from previous years this means that throughout a woman's lifetime, she will earn 14% less than a man. The Workplace Gender Equality agency shows the main reasons of the gender pay gap include discrimination in hiring women, female dominated industries attracting lower wages, as well as a woman's disproportionate share of unpaid domestic work. Feminism is still needed, even in first world countries. Men constantly benefit from misogyny, while women are always the victim.

If I were to apply for a job and get to the interview stage, I would have 30% less of a chance of getting the occupation than a man of the same traits who does the exact same thing. This is a clear representation of bias, whether intentional or unintentional, is unacceptable and a clear show of how the patriarchy twists minds and instincts. Become a feminist and stop this. Calling yourself a feminist does not mean you hate men or that you think they are worthless like this misogynist society has presented it to be.
