The University of Melbourne's Elite Athlete Program

Applications for the <u>Elite Athlete Program</u> for students applying for study in 2022 are now open. Applicants could receive a conditional offer of support prior to the VTAC Change of Preference date of 20 December 2021. The Elite Athlete Program provides elite and emerging student-athletes with financial and in-kind support to assist them to reach their potential whilst studying at the University of Melbourne.

Benefits can include:

- Up to \$4,000 to assist with competition and travel costs from High Performance and Friends of the Sports Association Scholarships
- Physiotherapy services (fully or partially subsidised with on campus practice Elite Academy)
- Professional Strength and Conditioning coaching and programming
- 12-month Aquatic and Fitness Centre membership
- Subsidies for inter-varsity representative sporting events

Australian Taxation Office Tax File Number (TFN)

Year 12 students are reminded that they need a Tax File Number to enrol in a CSP (Commonwealth Supported Place) course at university.

Students must apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.

What Do I Need to Remember to be Successful in my First Year of Uni?

- Attend orientation and transition activities *that way I can find out about support and advisory services available to me!*
- Seek assistance to learn expectations of my lecturers *I will have to learn about tertiary* essay writing, using sources, avoiding plagiarism, and managing my time, etc.
- Remember to ask for help no-one will necessarily be offering any!
- I will need to be an independent learner *my lecturers and tutors will not be reminding me about deadlines!*
- I will need to take charge of my own learning *no-one will be checking up on me to see if I am keeping up with work or assignments!*
- I will need to organise my time effectively there are no bells to remind me where to be!
- Remember that my classes may be much larger than what I've been used to at school I
 will receive less individual attention!
- Make friends *building new friendship groups will help me cope and help me stay motivated!*
- I will be learning new skills that will be critical for my success I will have to learn important research and referencing skills!



The Good Universities Guide states that *paramedics provide pre-hospital emergency care, treatment and specialised transport for patients* - <u>Good Universities Guide - Paramedic.</u>

Working as an ambulance paramedic means that no two days are ever the same. What a paramedic does can be as varied as *restarting a patient's heart down* to helping solve social welfare issues. Ambulance paramedics are called when people feel they have no other options and are suffering what feels like an emergency to them. An interesting fact to remember when applying to become a paramedic is that the majority of the workload is not lights and sirens driving to save a patient's life. *This job is more about helping people in their time of need as opposed to being a hero.*
