

Careers in Machine Learning



What are Machine Learning Careers?

Machine learning is a branch of Artificial Intelligence (AI) that gives machines the ability to learn from data and perform tasks by themselves. The <u>2023 Future Jobs Report</u>, has found AI and Machine Learning Specialist as the number one growing job in the world! But there are many career opportunities in the field, including Machine Learning Researchers, AI Engineers, and Data Scientists. And, as the world of AI continues to expand, new occupations will emerge.

What skills and strengths are needed?

Careers in AI require strengths and skills in computer science and maths and statistics. Professionals often have qualifications and experience in computer programming, data science, software engineering, or information technology. Employers also value skills in communication, teamwork, critical thinking, and leadership.

What are the pathways?

Pathways typically involve completing an undergraduate degree in data science, computer science, or statistics, but continuous learning is crucial as technology evolves rapidly and graduate study may be required for advanced roles.



Do you play sports? Does it help or hinder your studies, and do you think it's useful for your career?

<u>Year13</u> and <u>Visa</u> teamed up to ask 1,250 thirteen to twenty-three year-olds from across Australia these questions as part of their PlayOn youth sport survey, and this is what they found...


The age most young people stop playing sports is 15.

40% of young people don't play sport, with the top reason being so they have more time to study.

Of those who do play sport, the majority believe it benefits their studies because it helps clear their mind, lift their mood, give them energy, improve their productivity, and helps them sleep. Interestingly, only a minority thought sports helped with their careers, despite most identifying it as developing teamwork, resilience, collaboration, discipline, and leadership - all skills high up on employers' most wanted lists!

What this means is that young people see the benefits of sport and the transferable skills playing them builds, but aren't connecting them to the broader context of their careers and lives.

So if you've dropped sport to focus on study, might it be time to think again? Rather than seeing sport as conflicting with your study and career aspirations, can you connect it to helping you reach them instead?


Why Students Should Consider Early Childhood Education as a Career

<u>SF3</u> is Australia's international smartphone film festival. Open now to filmmakers of all ages. Your film must be shot entirely on a smartphone or tablet. Deadlines 1 June-1 September, 2023. Student entry fee from \$8-\$35 depending on category and deadline.



<u>Owlypia Online</u> is a multiple choice knowledge competition. Students aged 9-18 compete with peers internationally, showing their knowledge and skills in their favourite subject areas. Register now for the event happening 1 July 2023. You could qualify for Globals in Cambridge and Boston!
