# What's happening in Term 1

# Inquiry

This year we have introduced a new program-

Mappen.

In Years 5 & 6, students will be exploring the unit 'Ethics and Emotions' in Term 1. They will consider ethical dilemmas as they learn about the value of honesty, respect, and loyalty. Students will also consider the influence that the media and others have on them. With a focus on student voice and agency, their final assignment entails designing a product that represents their identity.





## **Specialist for Semester 1**

During Semester One, Year 6 students will participate in our fantastic specialist programs.

#### **Term 1 Friday Morning Sports**

#### English

Year 6 students will participate in a broad range of activities in English this Semester. In Reading and Viewing, students will be analysing and critiquing a range of persuasive advertisements and autobiographies. In connection to this, in Writing, they will be creating a persuasive advertisement of their choice, that must include a range of elements. To end the term, they will explore autobiographies, capturing their own life in words. In Speaking and Listening, students will be participating and contributing to discussions, as well as developing and supporting their opinions.

#### **Mathematics**

Year 6 students will participate in a vast range of activities in Mathematics this Semester. As we move towards using the new Victorian Curriculum of Mathematics 2.0, students will cover topics such as Place Value, Units of Measurement and Multiplicative Thinking in their first unit. Followed by Statistical Investigation and Geometric Reasoning in their second.
