What's happening in Term 4

Year 4 PBL

This term for Learning for Life we are focussing on Media Art. The students will be engaged in learning about planning, creating and presenting projects digitally. The Year 4 team will enhance cross-curricular learning by tying Media Arts together with Literacy.



Sunsmart

<u>English</u>

Year 4 students will participate in a broad range of activities in English this Semester. In Reading and Viewing, students will be focusing on exploring biographies of significant individuals throughout history that are notable. They will also be exploring information reports, zoning in on endangered Australian animals. In Writing, students will be focusing on collecting information about themselves to create an autobiography. They will also be focusing on an endangered Australian animal to research and compose an information report about. They will develop their speaking skills through different presentations of work in the classroom.

Mathematics

Year 4 students will participate in a broad range of activities in Mathematics this Semester. In Number and Algebra, students will extend their understanding of money through problem solving and real life experiences. In Measurement and Geometry students will explore 2D and 3D shapes through problem solving and hands on activities. They will also be exploring location through maps and giving/ receiving directions.

How to support your child's reading

Create a regular time and space for reading each night. Encourage your child to read the text type that we are working on at school. Ask your child questions about the text they are reading.

Ask your children to predict what will happen next.

Clarify the meaning of new words, try to work it out and check in a dictionary.

Ask questions about what is happening in the text and try to answer them.
