#### Guaranteed ATARs for 2022

The university has taken into consideration the challenges and disruptions to Year 12 students over the last two years, and all applicants who meet the course prerequisites and guaranteed ATAR for their preferred course will achieve a place at the University when they receive their ATAR on 13 December 2021. The new guaranteed ATARs aim to provide students with comfort and assurance, allowing them to prepare for life and study at the University of Melbourne in 2022.

To be eligible for guaranteed entry, applicants must also meet the following requirements:

- All course prerequisites and achieve the ATAR (or notional ATAR) outlined in the table below
- Apply to their preferred undergraduate course at the University via VTAC

#### **Career as a Cardiac Technologist**

The Good Careers Guide states that <u>Cardiac Technologists</u> provide technical services for the investigation, diagnosis, and treatment of heart disease. As part of the cardiology team, cardiac technologists operate a range of specialist equipment, which provides data that cardiologists and other medical practitioners use for patient care.

Cardiac Technologists fulfill tasks such as -

- Recording the electrical activity of the heart, from which the heart rate is measured, and pattern and rhythm interpreted.
- Operating equipment used in diagnosing and monitoring disorders of the heart, kidneys, nervous system.

Cardiac Technologists are part of the cardiology team but are not surgeons nor do they have medical degrees. To become a cardiac technologist, one usually has to complete a degree at university with a major in *biophysics, health science, nursing, physiology, or exercise physiology.*

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# Federation Snapshot of Federation University Australia in 2021

- Federation University Australia was formed when the former University of Ballarat and the Gippsland Campus of Monash University were amalgamated
- FedUni's history actually dates back to 1870
- FedUni is regional Victoria's largest education institution, with <u>campuses</u> in Ballarat, Berwick, Gippsland, the Wimmera, and Brisbane providing easy access to study, and approximately 1200 staff committed to teaching excellence and student support
- FedUni has over 24,000 domestic and international students and 110,000 alumni across Australia and the world
- FedUni offers a broad range of <u>courses</u> from apprenticeships to bachelor degrees
- FedUni offers a range of <u>scholarships</u>, <u>bursaries and grants</u>. One particularly significant scholarship is the <u>FedUni High Achievers Scholarship</u> which is worth \$18,000 including one year of on-campus accommodation, for eligible students who attain an ATAR of 80+
- FedUni students can access a wide range of services and support to assist them
- Students who choose to live in residence gain the best start to their university experience - <u>accommodation</u>. First-year undergraduate students are <u>guaranteed</u>\* accommodation during their first year of study
- FedUni students also have the opportunity to study overseas at a range of institutions. Students can participate in a variety of programs that will provide them with a global experience. Students can choose between short-term programs and semester-long programs - <u>Study Abroad and Exchange</u>
- FedUni's <u>Industry Placement Program</u> provides students with an opportunity to gain valuable workplace experience, to enhance their knowledge and skills
