Liturgical Jottings

Our Eyes

Our bodies, our minds and hearts and all our senses are very much part of our participation in the liturgy. Second Vatican Council calls for the faithful to have full, active and conscious participation in liturgical celebrations (SC art. 14). We hear in the first reading: "Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky." Yes many times our eyes are looking upward. Not just to see the Lord rising but at the end of time to see him come down. The Ceiling of the Sistine Chapel makes people look up to see the marvels of God depicted in great artwork. Like Abraham we may look up at the sky to see the stars and wonder at God's creation. The use of incense encourages us to lift our eyes to see the smoke rise with our prayers to the Lord. Artists and architects give us opportunities to raise our eyes heavenward.

Looking at the Readings

The Feast of the Ascension is really a kind of liminal moment in the Easter season. It is a time between times; a moment when we have left one place but have not yet arrived at a second. While the narratives that describe the Ascension fit well into the unfolding story of redemption, the feast celebrates the exaltation of Jesus. The readings allow us to focus on this theological point while we commemorate a turning point in the life of the church. We do this by considering the enthronement of Christ in the heavens and the new body of Christ on earth.

Many of the Easter accounts have directed our attention to the appearances of Jesus which were intended to strengthen the Christians' belief in his bodily resurrection.

Today we stand awestruck, watching Jesus ascend into the clouds of heaven, there to be enthroned at the right hand of God. Today is a day to be overwhelmed by the reality of the divinity of the one whom we have known in his humanity.

Christ who ascended into heaven in his body carries on what he began on earth through his new body, the community of believers. He teaches through its apostles and evangelists. He ministers through its prophets and pastors. We have not been left alone; we have his power, the same power with which he performed marvels when he walked the earth. WORLD MS DAY 30 May 2025 - Multiple Sclerosis (MS) is a long-lasting (chronic) disease of the central nervous system. It is thought to be an autoimmune disorder where the body attacks itself by mistake. MS is an unpredictable disease that affects people differently. Some may only have mild symptoms whereas others may lose their ability to see clearly, write, speak or walk, when communication between the brain and other parts of the body becomes disrupted. The number of Australians living with MS is increasing at an accelerating rate. It's important for employers, family, carers and general public to have a better understanding of how MS impacts people living with the condition. For people with no visible symptoms, we often incorrectly assume there is nothing wrong with them. World MS Day falls on May 30. In Australia, MS Awareness Month is recognised in May, a time to advocate for better support and access to diagnosis and treatment. Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.



Exploring the Word

Jesus has alluded to the fact that he is going away but that he will one day return. In the meantime, the disciples, the community to whom John is writing his gospel, are living the 'in-between times'. Jesus has come once in the flesh and has promised to return at the end of the world and so this instruction is a continuation of the teaching on how disciples should live out their faith in Jesus' absence: they must keep his word, the word of God. 'And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us (Jn 1:14)'. The will not be alone in this task as Jesus has promised to send the Advocate of the Holy Spirit who will continue to unfold the word as the Church grows and meets new situations and challenges.

- You could look at the First Reading from Acts which highlights one such situation.
- In conferring the gift of peace on his disciples, Jesus is preparing them for his departure and his absence. This will be a trial for the disciples but the peace of Christ and the Holy Spirit will help them to understand his return to the Father and to be confident that they too will one day make the journey.
- How do you cope with the 'absence' of Jesus? In what ways do you experience Christ's presence?
- How do you experience the Spirit in your life?
