First Reading Is 2:1-5

The Lord will gather all nations in eternal peace in the kingdom of God,

The vision of Isaiah son of Amoz, concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

In the days to come
the mountain of the Temple of the Lord
shall tower above the mountains
and be lifted higher than the hills.
All the nations will stream to it,
peoples without number will come to it;

'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord,

to the Temple of the God of Jacob that he may teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths; since the Law will go out from Zion, and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.'

The time has come, our salvation is near.

You know 'the time' has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon – let us give up all the things we prefer to do under the cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Acciamation Ps 84:8


Alleluia, alleluial

Gospel Mt 24:37-44

Stay awake, you must be ready.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'.



Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

Our Lord loved to unfurl the scroll of the Prophet Isaiah in his local synagogue. The poetic image of swords being hammered into ploughshares reverberated into his renouncing violence against the Roman occupying army in his own time. When will this picture come true for all human beings for all time?

Only God knows! We don't know any more than we know when a burglar might target our home. But our ignorance of God's timetable is no excuse for being fatalistic and sleepy. We have our own span of life providing the timetable for our own contribution to the hammering of swords into ploughshares.

Recent Popes, especially St John Paul II, have taken up this theme for our times, teaching more restrictive criteria for using armed force, even dropping the term 'just war' to very small print in the Catechism.

We could pause for a moment to pray to be awake to our opportunities to shape society in the light of the vision of Isalah and the practice of Jesus the Prince of Peace.

Coming on-time... going on-cue

"Advent is a special time of hope and waiting for the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

It is a time of becoming more aware of God's presence in our lives. It is also a time of preparing ourselves more deeply in the practices of our faith as we prepare to celebrate Christmas.

For the four weeks of Advent this year, St Brendan's parish has the theme... "Coming on-time... going on-cue."

The Mass is a life-giving celebration and not something we do out of duty. Our intention is to deepen our prayer at Mass and strengthen our motivation. We have sadly noticed that we are getting worse as a parish at "coming on-time... going on-cue." People are arriving late and leaving early. This does not encourage communal prayer and is distracting for others. We understand that there are times when arriving on-time for Mass is beyond your control and leaving early might be essential. However, it should not be the norm.

The Mass is divided into four parts. Each part is significant.

We will explore these parts in light of the Gospels through Advent.

- 1st Sunday of Advent- The Introductory Rites- "Stay Awake."
- 2nd Sunday of Advent- The Liturgy of the Word- "A voice cries in the wilderness."
- 3rd Sunday of Advent- The Liturgy of the Eucharist- "He will prepare your way before you."
- 4th Sunday of Advent- The Concluding Rites- "Emmanuel, a name which means 'God-is-with-us."







FROM THE SANDHURST MISSION AND PASTORAL COUNCIL PREPARATION AND CONSULTATION PLAN 2022 - 2023


- I dream of a "missionary option", that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channelled for the evangelisation of today's world, rather than for her self preservation.
- A synodal Church is a Church which listens, which realises that listening is more than simply hearing.

- The establishment of a Diocesan Pastoral Council, to be called the Sandhurst Mission and Pastoral Council, was a key recommendation in the 2020 Go Forth Review of the Diocese. This Council will support synodal governance in the Diocese through a structure that builds coresponsibility and discernment in leadership and decision making. It will strengthen our capacity to operate in a strategic and collaborative way, by drawing on the best possible advice of lay people and clergy for pursuing the Church's mission.

- All the baptised share responsibility for the mission and for structures that facilitate the living out of the mission entrusted to the Church. A key learning from the listening and dialogue phase of the Plenary Council of Australia and the Synod on Synodality is that the people of God are seeking inclusion and opportunities to exercise co-responsibility for governance and leadership of the pastoral life of the Diocese. Establishing a Sandhurst Mission and Pastoral Council is a significant commitment by our Diocese to create a structure that supports synodal governance, leadership and decision making. As steps are taken to establish these structures, it is also important to inform, prepare and consult the people of God along the way.
