Arts Industry Snapshot




The Arts and Recreation Services industry includes art galleries, museums, and theatres. It also includes employers that offer sporting and recreation services such as gyms, indoor sport centres, and amusement centres. The top employing occupations in this industry are:

- 1. Sports coaches, instructors, and officials
- 2. Fitness instructors
- 3. Sportspersons
- 4. Receptionists
- 5. Visual arts and crafts professionals

Data from the <u>2022 Australian Jobs Report</u> indicates it's a small industry, accounting for around 2% of all jobs, 75% of which are in capital cities. The Arts and Recreation workforce is relatively young, with 26% of employees aged 15 to 24. It offers lots of flexible work, with almost one quarter of workers self-employed, and around half employed part-time.

Selection Folios for Creative Courses



What's involved?

The most important thing is to understand the requirements - if a folio asks for 6 photographs, don't submit 10 drawings! officers Selection won't consider outside of the applications task parameters. Ensure you complete any written task components to provide purpose and context and to explain the meaning behind your work.

What should Linclude?

Do I need a folio?

Many VET and university creative courses use selection folios instead of, or as well, as the ATAR. Ensure your read entry requirements carefully, as you won't be considered if a folio is compulsory and you don't submit one. If a folio submission is optional, remember that it may be used to adjust your rank and increase your chance of being selected which makes it worthwhile?

When should I start?

Look on course websites at this year's selection task requirements to get an idea of what your folio should contain. Starting now means you can capture your creative process, which is what selection officers look for. It will also save you the stress of putting it together just before the deadlines which usually coincide with exams. Application deadlines are final and institutions do not make exceptions to cut off times.



Your folio doesn't need to contain masterpieces, rather selection officers want to see a process that reflects your imagination, curiosity, inspirations and passions. Your folio should be a true reflection of you and your artistic journey.



Bachelor of Arts Vs. Bachelor of Fine Arts



Some people get them confused, (and it's easy to see why), but there is a big difference between a Bachelor of Arts and a Bachelor of Fine Arts!

While you can study art-related subjects in a Bachelor of Arts, the title refers to the 'liberal arts' - 'liberal' meaning broad, and 'arts' meaning a learned skill.

There are literally dozens of subjects to choose from within Bachelor of Arts degrees, but they are academic Humanities and Social Sciences subjects such as Languages, Anthropology, Criminology, Literature, Economics, Creative Writing, History, Media, Philosophy, Politics, Psychology, and Sociology.

In a Bachelor of Fine Arts, you can specialise in creative and practical subjects like Acting, Dance, Film and Television, Music Theatre, Production, Screenwriting, Theatre, Visual Art and more.
