
An Abundance of Katherines John Green

This book is great one for statistics fans and economy lovers.








Tiny Pretty Things Sona Charaipotra & Dhonielle Clayton






Booked Kwame Alexander

A fiercely told survivorship novel about one girl's determination to push her body to win gold at the Olympics, and the power of uniting as women to speak out against injustice.




The F Team Rawah Arja
