Aspire Community Contribution Program

Open to domestic and international students

Requirements: Year 12 pass, VCE minimum prerequisite study scores and ATAR required

At La Trobe, we believe there is more to being a good student than marks alone. The <u>Aspire program</u> rewards the skills and knowledge students gain from the positive impact they have made on their school or community through *community service*, *leadership*, or *volunteering*. Designed to give Year 12's the tools they need to succeed at La Trobe and beyond, students accepted into the Aspire program will get:

- A taste of university life at La Trobe with special on-campus events before the year commences
- The chance to meet and connect with like-minded students
- Access to exclusive study support resources to help you prepare for exams
- Access to La Trobe's extensive library and campus resources
- Additional \$1,500 funding for student exchange opportunities, just for being an Aspire student

Successful applicants also receive their *early conditional offer* late September or early October for their chosen course along with minimum ATAR requirements. Many courses have a minimum ATAR of 55.00, but some professional degree programs have higher requirements.

Up to 40 <u>Aspire scholarships</u>, worth \$5,000 per year for up to four years, will be awarded to leading eligible Aspire students.

The <u>Aspire ATAR Table</u> shows the minimum ATAR for some degree courses for entry through Aspire in 2024. Should an applicant's preferred course not be listed on this table, then the minimum ATAR is 50.00.

Applicants are required to provide information about the length and frequency of their community service and/or volunteering experience. Applicants will need to provide two 100-word statements responding to the following criteria:

- List the activities you've been involved in and describe them to us.
- How long you've been involved in community engagement and/or volunteering.
- Details of your impact (your impact on the community and your own self-development through your actions).

Types of volunteering include -

- fundraising for charity
- helping to run a school or community club
- coaching a sports team
- volunteering at a nursing home
- mentoring younger students
- leading as a school or house captain

Students can opt to do the *Essendon Football Club* dual diploma OR the *Cricket Victoria* dual diploma.

Entry into this program requires a successful completion of Year 12.

Career as an Air Attack Supervisor

According to the <u>Australian Maritime Safety Authority</u>, Air Attack Supervisors are **responsible** for the safe and efficient coordination of aerial dispersant application and tactical aircraft activity in support of the incident. The Air Attack Supervisor is responsible for ensuring safety standards are maintained at all times; for the provision of specialist aviation advice at the incident; and for collaborating in the preparation of Air Operations section of the Incident Action Plan (IAP).

Students usually get training in this field once they have become qualified <u>firefighters</u>. An interesting article to read is <u>Being an Air Attack Supervisor</u>.

Snapshot of La Trobe University in 2023

- La Trobe is over 50 years old having enrolled its first students in 1967.
- La Trobe University is ranked in the world's top 250 universities by Times Higher Education
 World University rankings 2022, is one of the world's best young universities, and in the top
 1% of universities worldwide Rankings & Ratings.
- La Trobe has more than 36 000 students and over 3 000 staff, with many <u>courses</u> on offer including numerous double degree options, and postgraduate courses too.
- La Trobe has three metro and four regional campuses plus a number of residential facilities.
- Over 50% of students who study at the Bendigo campus come from outside of Bendigo <u>La Trobe Bendigo</u> with over 500 students living on campus <u>La Trobe Bendigo Accommodation</u>.
- La Trobe offers many <u>scholarships</u> both access and equity scholarships, and academic merit scholarships.
- Student Exchange opportunities are extensive at La Trobe.
- La Trobe ensures that there are opportunities for students to develop skills beyond the knowledge they are gaining at university through work experience, volunteering, and student exchange opportunities, etc.
- The excellent <u>Global Markets Accelerator Program</u> is one example of aiding entrepreneurial students in connecting with markets beyond Australia.

- La Trobe's <u>Student Excellence Academy</u> provides life changing support and enrichment opportunities that expand on current study and give employment advantages to students.
- La Trobe offers an early admissions program called the <u>Aspire Early Entry Program</u> which is a
 way to access an adjusted Aspire ATAR for a preferred course and secure an early conditional
 offer. There are multiple streams to choose from, so students who give back to their
 community and achieved good results in Year 11, may be offered a place in their preferred
 course before they complete Year 12. These students are also eligible for <u>one of 40 Aspire</u>
 Scholarships.
- There has also been a recent restructure of some courses offered in Allied Health Health.
