Literacy

During this term, we will be learning how to read and write persuasive texts and narrative texts, with a strong focus on grammar, spelling and sentence structures. We will be practising comprehension skills as we read, to ensure the children can understand both literal and inferential questions. There will be a continued focus on handwriting, including correct pencil grip, starting points, and letter formation.

The children will also be learning about oral language and how to speak clearly and confidently in front of an audience. This will tie in with our concert item.

Maths

The learning foci will include:

Number and Place Value:

- Multiplication
- Division
- Fractions

Statistics and Probability:

- Data Ask questions to collect data
- Present the data clearly using tables and graphs



Our Integrated Inquiry topic this term asks the big question, 'What happens when we change everyday materials?"

The focus of this Science unit is for students to understand that everyday materials can be physically changed in a variety of ways. They will conduct investigations with different objects, including everyday materials and play dough. Predictions and comparisons will be made about how the shapes of objects made from different materials can be physically changed through actions such as bending, stretching and twisting. Students will also explore how materials change when warmed or cooled.





Religion

Our Religion unit this term focuses on the key events in the liturgical year and symbols and rituals in the Catholic Church. We will explore the Sacraments of Initiation and will learn more about Saint James and Mary MacKillop, Australia's first Saint.
