Year 5/6 Curriculum Letter Term 4, 2025



Dear Parents,

Welcome back for the final term of 2025 and the Year 6 students' final term at primary school. We are so proud of all the 5 and 6 students for their hard work in contributing to the success of our Disney Frozen Jr production. It was such an amazing couple of nights showcasing the various talents of our wonderful students. We are looking forward to a busy term filled with interesting and fun learning opportunities. Before we know it, the Year 5 students will be preparing and presenting their leadership speeches and become the leaders of our school. In Year 6, we will be working towards Year 6 Graduation and all the incredible experiences that come with the end of primary school.

Religious Education

- Where it all began How can so many people believe in one God?
- Wait for the Saviour He will come

Inquiry

The Inquiry topic this term will be focusing on History and exploring the unit, "What's Our Story?" The students will be learning about Australian history, with Inquiry questions focusing on:

- What effects has Australia's colonial past had on its people, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people?
- What significant events have shaped Australia's history?
- Why have people in the past migrated to Australia and why do people continue to migrate to Australia?



Reading

In Reading, there will be a particular emphasis on comprehension strategies focusing on reading for deeper understanding. We will be exploring main ideas, comparing and contrasting, summarising and paraphrasing. To further develop reading strategies this term, Year 5 students will also explore Literature Circles, in which they read and respond (in different roles) to the same book in small groups. This text exploration provides opportunities for students to discuss their different interpretations to expand their understanding of the text.



Writing

In Writing, Year 5 students will be focusing on Speech Writing and will investigate different ways that they can connect with their audience in preparation for their Leadership Speeches. Students will also explore the features and structure of formal debate writing as well as create different forms of poetry. Towards the end of the term, we will focus on the features and structures of different types of poems. Students will examine and use different literary devices to engage their reader.

In Year 6, there will also be a large focus on recount and reflective writing. Each student will then use these reflections to create a Memory Book of their primary school years that is unique to them. Spelling, editing, grammar and punctuation will remain as foci throughout the term.

Speaking and Listening

Towards the end of term, Year 5 students will discuss and consider student leadership positions for 2026. The requirements, expectations and selection process for these positions will be outlined closer to this time. The Year 6 students will continue to have opportunities to present in formal and informal settings throughout the term, through debating, assemblies, school tours and class discussions.
