We have been very busy getting organised and excited for our three day/two night trip to the YMCA Lady Northcote which is coming around very quickly! Needless to say we are going to have a super time.

Literacy

In Literacy this term, our focus is on honing the skills, knowledge, and understanding necessary to read, comprehend, research, analyse, and critique informative and procedural texts with fluency. We're deepening our practice of substantive talk, utilising 'turn and talk buddies,' engaging in small group and whole class discussions to reinforce skills and foster rich substantive conversations. Our emphasis is on paraphrasing and synthesising conversation points to enhance comprehension and critical thinking.

In Reading, students will continue to enhance their comprehension, accuracy, fluency, and vocabulary skills through explicit teaching focus lessons, independent reading opportunities, and personalised clinics. They'll select books that align with their reading purpose, ensuring a good fit for their individual preferences and learning needs. This term, our focus in Reading remains on developing the skills and understanding required to fluently engage with informative and procedural texts.

Moving to Writing, we're aligning our focus genre with our Reading curriculum, delving into informative and procedural texts. Students will explore various examples of these text types, following the writing process to craft their own pieces in these genres. After completing a writing sample for informative texts, students will set their goals for the term, initiating planning and research phases centred around a country of their choosing.

Building on established practices of goal setting, students will monitor their reading and writing progress through learning goal templates and our class goal board. They'll present evidence of their progress during individual reading conferences, utilising the Seesaw app to share updates on their goals.

Our daily Word Work sessions will target vocabulary relevant to our current areas of inquiry, mathematics, and other learning domains. Academic vocabulary receives special attention, with students self-assessing their understanding, delving into word meanings, analysing word structures, and synthesising their understanding over each fortnight. Additionally, we're integrating the International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA) and etymology to enhance pronunciation and spelling skills.







Maths

In Numeracy, Grade 3/4 students are reinforcing and expanding their skills in the four operations, encompassing whole numbers, decimals, fractions, and monetary concepts. Building student confidence with multiplication facts up to 10 x 10 is crucial for their fluency, which can be supported at school and home through engaging resources such as songs, Mathletics Live, Toy Theatre and other online tools. Our lessons maintain a structured format, including Warm-up, Explicit Teaching, Independent Work/Clinic, and Reflection, with a challenging maths task integrated weekly. Students can access their maths learning goals via Seesaw, aligning with activities they can pursue at home through MyNumeracy.







Inquiry

In Inquiry, our focus shifts to the realm of Geography with the unit 'Australia's Neighbours.' Students will explore the location of Australia's neighbouring countries and the diverse characteristics of these places, before each student will select a specific country of focus. Some examples of our learning, tied nicely into our literacy information texts and real-world maths, will be using a globe to locate New Zealand, the Pacific Island nations, Papua New Guinea, Timor-Leste and Indonesia, identifying the direction of each country from Australia and describing their similarities and differences.

Values

Regarding Values, we continue to embrace the Resilience, Rights, and Respectful Relationships Curriculum, delving into the theme of 'Positive Coping and Problem Solving.' Additionally, we'll integrate the 'Resilience Project' into our Wellbeing curriculum, equipping each student with their own journal to practice and promote positive mental health strategies, fostering resilience.


