Religious Education

We are learning to ...

- identify various kinds of prayer: thanksgiving, praise, sorrow, petition and adoration.
- ∉ explore some of Jesus' prayer experiences and the place of prayer in the life of Peter or Paul as Jew, as outlined in Scripture.

English

We are learning to ...

- establish school and home reading routines including learning to be active and engaged readers who can choose good fit texts.
- read and respond to queries from our class texts War Horse and How Was That Built?
- We are learning to write persuasive texts.
- We are learning to write to entertain the reader through narrative writing.

Mathematics

We are learning to ...

- interpret and compare data sets.
- interpret, compare and order numbers with more than 2 decimal places.
- Explore natural numbers and their factors, recognising multiples and determining if one number is divisible by another.
- Investigate number patterns.

Inquiry

We are learning to ...

- understand how and why laws are enforced and the roles and responsibilities of law enforcement.
- identifying who can be an Australian citizen.
- explore the rights, responsibilities and shared values of Australian citizenship and understand ways citizens can participate in society.
- investigate shared beliefs and values in our community.
- develop strategies to promote health, safety and wellbeing.
