What does the Christian life offer?

Being a Catholic Christian involves more than belief in God. It is a commitment to follow the teachings of Jesus Christ, and help make known the message of the Gospel.

By choosing to 'Come and See...' you will begin to discover not just who God is, but who you are too. It is a journey of the heart, the focus being more relational than knowledge focused.

All are invited, to embark on this journey with God

At various stages in life people respond to God's call and so are drawn to explore the Christian faith.

The Catholic Church has a process for welcoming and supporting those open to embark on the journey. The process is known as The Rite of Christian Initiation. It is a journey that takes place with peers who are also seeking to know God, and others who have already made a commitment to do so.

'Come and See...' is the first stage of the journey. It is an invitation to engage in conversations, experiences, and activities that open individuals to an appreciation of:

- · What we believe
- How we live
- How we pray and worship
- · How we serve

The inquirers will be accompanied by a group of young people and adults throughout the journey, which begins on Tuesday 11th September, 6.30pm-8pm, Sacred Heart Parish Centre, Thornlie; Cnr Ovens Rd & Discovery drive.



What is required?

- An open heart and mind
- Willingness to participate in the six Come and See sessions
- Commitment to attend the Tuesday evening welcome and wind up sessions, plus the four Sunday afternoon sessions
- Completion of a Parental Consent form prior to the first session
- The sessions will not all be in the same venue, car pooling arrangements can be worked out
- At the wind up choose whether or not to continue the journey.
