Sent into bat, Marist 5A made an immediate statement, scoring freely and putting the opposition under pressure from the outset against St Patrick's College.

Charlie Maher anchored the innings with composure and class, while Oliver Guardala provided early momentum with a quick-fire 18* (12). At the drinks break, Marist were in complete control at 1/114, with five batters retired and the run rate climbing steadily.

A collapse of 6/5—including a hat-trick—momentarily halted the momentum and gave SPC a brief opening. However, Charlie and Jett Killen steadied the innings, regaining control and finishing strongly. Jett was outstanding, producing a commanding 60* (39), an innings highlighted by 10 boundaries and a six. Charlie finished unbeaten on 26* (41), guiding Marist to an imposing 7/197.
