WELCOME

Welcome to the 2023 School year! It has been a wonderful start to the year with children settling in well to the new routines of school.

Please find below an outline of the curriculum areas that will be covered throughout the term.

ENGLISH

Reading and Viewing

- Establishing positive reading routines and expectations
- Using a range of reading strategies to gain meaning
- Building automatic recall of high frequency words

Writing

- Generating and articulating story writing ideas
- Constructing simple sentences
- Listening for and recording sounds in words
- Using capital letters, full stops and spaces between words
- Practising correct letter formations

Speaking and Listening

- Engaging in classroom discussions
- Generating rhyming words
- Building letter-sound knowledge
- Explicit teaching of 1 letter sounds (graphs) and 2 letter sounds (digraphs)

MATHEMATICS

- Data
 - Collecting information using a range of question types
 - Representing data using pictographs, bar graphs and tallies
- Counting
 - Using efficient strategies when counting collections of objects
 - Counting forwards by ones from various starting points
- Place value
 - Reading, writing, ordering, making and using 1 and 2 digit numbers
- Length
 - Using informal units to measure length
 - Introducing formal units of measure metres and centimetres

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:28)

- Explaining the meaning of scripture stories about the life, death and resurrection of Jesus
- Interpreting the stories of Jesus, making connections to experiences of family and friendship
- Reflecting on ways Jesus shows us how to live in right relationships
- Explaining ways a church and school community are part of the family of God
- Interpreting experiences of family and friendship in relation to God's family
- Reflecting on how they live as part of a family, school and the family of God

INQUIRY LEARNING - Diversity

This term students will:

- Explore the history of our local area and school and how it has changed over time
- Investigate how technology, transport and toys have changed over time
- Compare what family life was like in the past to how it is today

HOME LEARNING

All students are encouraged to read for at least 15 minutes each night. Even though some children are becoming independent readers, it is still very important to maintain the home reading program. Reading aloud to an adult helps not only improve accuracy, but fluency, expression and comprehension of what we are reading. Sharing positive reading experiences with loved ones helps foster a love of reading.

Take home Readers

Take home readers will commence week 4. Please ensure that your child is reading for 10-15 mins each night. I suggest that your child reads their reader 3 times.

- 1. **You read it to them.** This is an opportunity for you to model what readers do, such as look at the pictures for unknown words, sound out words unknown words and point to words with your finger. etc
- 2. You read it together (to develop confidence)
- 3. They read it to you or to someone else.

<u>Please remind your child to change their reader each morning after they have completed their morning jobs.</u>

MAGIC 100 + Words

Your child will come home with their 'Magic words' book. These words will be checked periodically . Your child will be given a specific day during our 'Magic word week' in the junior school that they will be 'tested'. This testing will be 1-1. We ask for your patience with getting through the words. If your child is able to read all the words before 'Magic word week' we encourage you to practise writing/ spelling them and using them in a sentence.
