# What is a scholarship?

A scholarship is a sum of money awarded to an individual (either a one-off pay- Types of ment or a regular allowance) Scholarships to assist with that person's further education.

Every scholarship has different selection criteria and purposes, for example;

- rural students for their accommodation, or
- high academic (ATAR) results for entry to a particular institution course.

Can't answer that! Mostly because application processes differ significantly! Being willing to allocate time to the task is essential, and getting your head around the deadlines (found in the fine print!) is a no-brainer.

If you understand the TYPES of scholarships available, this will help immensely.

Funding sources for scholarships primarily come from:

- Australian Government
- University or TAFE
- Industry (for example an engineering company may offer a scholarship for a degree in engineer-Sometimes these may be tied to a particular university - sometimes not).
- **Philanthropic** (charitable organisations)

- Faculty Scholarships (e.g., Faculty of Health Sciences)
- Course Scholarships (e.g., Bachelor of Science)
